Any I-PASS account-related message from the Tollway will always request that customers call our customer service team directly (800-824-7277) or to securely log in to their I-PASS accounts. Official I-PASS email messages will never request any personal or credit card information.

Know your milepost when calling for help

Milepost signs are located every quarter mile along the Tollway system and identify the road, direction of travel and milepost number. To request roadway assistance or in the case of an incident, knowing your milepost location allows emergency responders to identify where you are and respond quicker. For roadway assistance or to report an incident on the Tollway, dial 1999.
