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## **ILLINOIS TOLLWAY SEEKS FIRMS FOR CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AND MATERIALS ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR WORK IN 2026 AND 2027**

*PSB 26-2 includes seven professional engineering services contracts worth an estimated \$57 million*

**DOWNERS GROVE, IL** – The Illinois Tollway today announced that it is seeking professional engineering firms to provide construction management and materials engineering services for seven new contracts worth an estimated \$57 million anticipated to be awarded in 2026.

Services will support the Illinois Tollway in managing, monitoring and coordinating remaining activities under the 16-year, \$15 billion *Move Illinois* program, as well as for the 7-year, \$2 billion *Bridging the Future* program and future capital program initiatives.

Firms interested in submitting Statements of Interest for PSB 26-2 as prime consultants or participating as subconsultants are invited to attend an optional pre-proposal meeting at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, June 23, 2026, at Drury Lane Events, 100 Drury Lane in Oakbrook Terrace, or via a virtual Microsoft Teams meeting option. Submissions for PSB 26-2 are due by 4:30 p.m. on July 10, 2026, with contracts expected to be awarded by the Illinois Tollway Board of Directors this fall, with work expected to begin in late 2026 and early 2027.

Illinois Tollway professional engineering services contracts are selected in accordance with the qualifications-based selection process (30 ILCS 535) Architectural, Engineering and Land Surveying Qualifications-Based Selection Act, which requires state agencies to select professional architects, engineers and surveyors based on demonstrated competence and professional qualifications. All contracts are presented to the Illinois Tollway Board of Directors for review and approval.

**About *Move Illinois***

The Illinois Tollway’s 16-year, \$15 billion capital program, *Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future*, is improving mobility, relieving congestion, reducing pollution, creating as many as 165,220 jobs and linking economies throughout the region. The first 13 years of *Move Illinois* are on schedule and within budget, delivering the new Illinois Route 390 Tollway and a rebuilt and widened Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) with its new SmartRoad corridor, as well as opening a new interchange connecting the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) to I-57. Progress continues on projects addressing the remaining needs of the existing Tollway system, delivering the new I-490 Tollway Project and reconstructing the Central Tri-State Tollway (I-294).

**About *Bridging the Future***

Approved by the Illinois Tollway Board of Directors in December 2024, *Bridging the Future* is a seven-year, \$2 billion plan designed to continue infrastructure improvements, bridging the gap between the agency’s current and next long-term capital program. Based on stakeholder feedback and engagement, investments in the people and firms working to improve regional mobility.

**About the Illinois Tollway**

The Illinois Tollway is a user-fee system that receives no state or federal funds for maintenance and operations. The agency maintains and operates 294 miles of roadways in 12 counties in Northern Illinois, including the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88), the Veterans Memorial Tollway (I-355), the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90), the Tri-State Tollway (I-94/I-294/I-80) and the Illinois Route 390 Tollway.

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
