**LONG-TERM CLOSURE OF BOLLMAN ROAD BRIDGE OVER
REAGAN MEMORIAL TOLLWAY (I-88) IN LEE COUNTY BEGINS FOR REPAIR WORK**
Closures needed into July to safely accommodate work on local crossroad bridge

DOWNERS GROVE, IL – Full closure of the Bollman Road Bridge carrying traffic over the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) in Lee County began Monday, June 1, for bridge repair work. The bridge is scheduled to remain closed into July.

The full closure of the Bollman Road Bridge is necessary because the local crossroad bridge over I-88 is too narrow to accommodate traffic while safely completing the maintenance and repair work. Work will include concrete and bridge deck repairs and sealing.

Construction signage are in place to alert drivers to lane closures on the bridges and local roads. The temporary closures are needed to accommodate traffic and provide a safe work zone. Up-to-date information will be posted on the Tollway website in the [Daily Construction Alert](#). All work is weather dependent.

Once work is completed at the Bollman Road Bridge, work is scheduled to begin on the nearby Nelson Road Bridge, including a full closure scheduled during July and August. Work on Nelson Bridge will include concrete and bridge deck repairs and sealing and bearing replacements.

On I-88, lanes closures will also be needed to accommodate the work on the bridges.

Closures are being coordinated with Lee County and Nelson Township, as well as local fire and police departments.

In 2026, Illinois Tollway work on the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88) will include repairs to local crossroad and mainline bridges in Whiteside, Lee, Ogle, Kane, and DuPage Counties.

This work is part of the Tollway's seven-year, \$2 billion *Bridging the Future* capital plan.

Work Zone Safety

Construction zone speed limits are in effect in all construction zones 24/7 and drivers should continue to watch for changing traffic patterns and use caution, especially when workers are present.

The Illinois Tollway reminds motorists that the "Move Over Law" requires motorists to change lanes or to slow down and proceed with caution when passing any vehicle on the side of the road with hazard lights activated. If you see flashing lights ahead, please move over or slow down.

Illinois State Police have zero tolerance for drivers speeding in work zones or for failure to comply with the Move Over Law. The minimum penalty for speeding in a work zone is \$250 with up to a \$25,000 fine and a 14-year jail sentence for hitting a roadway worker. Penalties for failure to slow down or move

over for a vehicle on the shoulder with flashing lights includes up to a \$10,000 fine, 2-year suspension of driving privileges and jail time, in extreme cases.

About *Bridging the Future*

Approved by the Illinois Tollway Board of Directors in December 2024, *Bridging the Future* is a seven-year, \$2 billion plan designed to continue infrastructure improvements, bridging the gap between the agency's current and next long-term capital program. Based on stakeholder feedback and engagement, *Bridging the Future* is addressing ongoing modernization initiatives and continuing to support investments in the people and firms working to improve regional mobility.

About the Illinois Tollway

The Illinois Tollway is a user-fee system that receives no state or federal funds for maintenance and operations. The agency maintains and operates 294 miles of roadways in 12 counties in Northern Illinois, including the Reagan Memorial Tollway (I-88), the Veterans Memorial Tollway (I-355), the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90), the Tri-State Tollway (I-94/I-294/I-80) and the Illinois Route 390 Tollway.
