
Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO)


DCEO provides financial incentives, grants, skill-based training, and other programming.

First Stop Business Information Center

<u>First Stop</u> is a single statewide resource for entrepreneurs and businesses to obtain comprehensive regulatory and permitting information. Business specialists provide professional guidance to entrepreneurs by helping them identify and navigate regulatory requirements for their business and link them to state and local resources.

- Regulatory Flexibility Program housed within the First Stop Business Information Center which serves as an ombudsman for small businesses. Staff reviews rules that state agencies propose and provides information about these rules to the small business community

Small Business Environmental Assistance Program (SBEAP)




SBEAP assists small businesses understand and comply with environmental obligations.

Regional Economic Development (Team RED)



- Provides targeted counseling and regional engagement across 10 regions statewide
- Assists businesses with tax incentives, tax credits, and other capital opportunities
- Supports business retention, expansion, and attraction







Advantage Illinois (AI) Participation Loan Program

Participating loan program provides funding to borrowers who have difficulty accessing traditional funding sources. DCEO takes subordinate position thereby reducing lender risk. If your lender wants to participate, please let us know.

Advantage Illinois

- Maximum participation is the <u>lesser</u>
 <u>of</u> 25% of the project, 50% of the loan, or \$2 million
- Maximum term is 7 years
- Rate fixed at 2% below lender rate with a floor of 2%
- Each \$50,000 participated, one FT job should be created or retained in the next two years

SEDI (Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Individual(s))

- Maximum participation is the <u>lesser</u>
 of 50% of the project (all sources of funding), 50% of the loan, or \$2
 million
- Maximum term is 7 years
- Rate fixed at 2% flat
- Each \$65,000 participated, one FT job should be created or retained in the next two years.



Climate Bank Finance Participation Loan Program

Financing for the start-up and/or expansion of ventures directly involving environmentally-supportive, "green" businesses, including those that address the adverse impacts of climate change. This program is overseen by DCEO and administered by the Illinois Finance Authority (IFA).

Standard

- Maximum participation is the <u>lesser of</u> 25% of the total project, 50% of the loan, \$2 million
- Maximum term is 7 years
- Rate fixed at 2% per annum
- Each \$50,000 participated, one FT job should be created or retained in the next two years

SEDI (Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Individual(s)) and VSBs (Very Small Businesses)

- Maximum participation is the <u>lesser</u>
 of 50% of the total project, 50% of the loan, \$2 million
- Maximum term is 7 years
- Rate fixed at 1% per annum
- Each \$65,000 participated, one FT job should be created or retained in the next two years.



Illinois Innovation Venture Fund (INVENT)

The Illinois Innovation Venture Fund (INVENT) is a \$114 million direct equity capital program funded through the U.S. Department of the Treasury State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) and administered by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO).

General Criteria

- Fundraising round up to \$20 million
- Company has less than 750 employees
- In good standing with the Illinois Secretary of State
- Established as C-corporation
- Principal place of business/headquarters is in Illinois
- At least 51% of the employees are based in Illinois
- Focused on addressing barriers to accessing capital
 - Lack of access/exposure to fundraising processes, particularly businesses owned by Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Individuals
 - Capital Disadvantaged Businesses where founders represent disproportionately impacted areas or historically underrepresented groups
 - Industry-specific challenges (e.g., long time horizon)
- Encourages public private collaboration
- Check size range from \$10,000 to \$6 million
- Investments in the form of preferred and common equity agreements, SAFEs or convertible notes







Business Enterprise Program

What is BEP?

The <u>Business Enterprise Program</u> is committed to fostering an inclusive and competitive business environment that will help businesses owned by Minorities, Women and Persons with Disabilities and Veterans increase their capacity, grow revenue, and enhance credentials.

Process is FREE of charge.

Eligibility

- At least 51% owned and controlled by a minority or demographic group
- Owner is a US citizen or permanent resident
- Annual gross sales of less than \$150 million

Benefits of being a BEP Vendor include:

- Access to State Opportunities
- Recognition within other municipalities and organizations
- Marketing Opportunities
- Listed on public online directory


